- Well-maintained Streets and Sidewalks
- Multiple Transportation Alternatives
- Accessibility to Transit
- Easy Traffic Flow
- Bicycle Access Lanes
- Ample On-street Parking

Public Safety

- Low Level of Crime
- Pedestrian Safety
- Police Presence and Traffic Enforcement

- Community Cohesiveness (e.g. Block Watch)
- Ample Street Lighting
- Community Disaster Preparedness

Vitality of Commercial District

- Wide Variety of Shops and Services
- Pedestrian/Streetscape Amenities
- Lots of "Non-chain" Shops and Services
- Business Stability (Low Turn-over)
- Scale and Aesthetics of Building Match Area
- Evening/Night Activity

Parks, Recreation and Culture

- Ample Passive Park Space
- Connections: Open Space Corridors and Trails
- Ample Number of Playfields
- Public Art e.g. Outdoor Sculpture (tie)
- Cultural Facilities e.g. galleries, theaters etc. (tie)
- High School Spectator Events

- Neighborhood Cleanliness
- Ethnic and Economic Diversity
